Aug 9: What Is a Disciple?– Colossians 2:2–14; 3:1–17

Supporting Scriptures: Matthew 28:19–20; Ephesians 4:1–32; 5:1–21; Galatians 2:20; 1 John 2:3–6; 1 Thessalonians 5:4–11

1. According to Colossians, what changes when someone belongs to Christ? Which “old self” habits are we called to put away, and what “new self” qualities are we to put on?
2. Jesus commands His followers to “make disciples” in Matthew 28. What is the difference between making disciples and simply making church members or attendees?
3. Galatians 2:20 says, “I have been crucified with Christ.” What does it practically look like to let Christ live through you in your daily life?
4. Ephesians describes the Church as one body with many gifts. How does spiritual growth happen both personally and together with other believers?
5. 1 John says that those who know Christ “walk as He walked.” What specific attitudes or behaviors of Jesus should become increasingly visible in a disciple?
6. Looking at all of these passages together, where do you see God calling you to grow in your own discipleship over the next few months?

Kid-Friendly Questions:

1. What does it mean to follow Jesus?
2. What are some things Jesus wants His followers to do?
3. How can you show kindness, love, and forgiveness like Jesus this week?
4. Who could you invite to learn about Jesus with you?



Aug 16: Find Your People – Mark 2:1–12

Supporting Scriptures: Hebrews 10:24–25; Acts 2:42–47

1. The paralyzed man's friends refused to give up until they brought him to Jesus. What qualities made them good friends, and what can we learn from their determination?
2. Hebrews encourages believers not to neglect meeting together. Why is gathering regularly with other Christians essential for spiritual growth?
3. Acts 2 describes the early Church sharing life together. Which parts of that community are easiest for you? Which are the hardest?
4. Who has helped carry you spiritually during difficult seasons? How did God use those people in your life?
5. Who in your life needs faithful Christian friends right now? What practical step could you take to encourage or include them?
6. Healthy Christian community requires vulnerability, encouragement, forgiveness, and accountability. Which of these do you find most challenging, and why?

Kid-Friendly Questions:

1. *Why did the man's friends bring him to Jesus?*
2. *How can good friends help us follow Jesus?*
3. *Why is it good to come to church and learn with other Christians?*
4. *What is one way you can be a good friend this week?*



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Aug 23: Find Your Place – John 15:7–15

Supporting Scriptures: James 1:22; 1 Timothy 4:5; Joshua 1:8; John 8:31–32

1. Jesus says His disciples “remain” or “abide” in Him. What habits help us stay connected to Christ throughout the week?
2. James warns against merely hearing God’s Word without doing it. What is one area where obedience is more difficult than simply gaining knowledge?
3. Joshua was instructed to meditate on God’s Word continually. What practical rhythms could help you spend more consistent time in Scripture?
4. Jesus says His friends know His will because He has made it known to them. How does Scripture shape our decisions and priorities?
5. What is the relationship between abiding in Christ and producing spiritual fruit? Can lasting fruit happen apart from Him?
6. If someone watched your daily life without hearing your words, what evidence would they see that you are connected to Christ?

Kid-Friendly Questions:

1. *What does it mean to stay close to Jesus?*
2. *Why is it important to read and listen to God’s Word?*
3. *How can obeying Jesus help us make good choices?*
4. *What kind of fruit does Jesus want us to grow, like love and kindness?*



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Aug 30: Find Your Purpose – Romans 10:14–15

Supporting Scriptures: Acts 1:8; 1 Peter 4:10; 2 Corinthians 9:6–12

1. Paul asks, “How can they believe unless someone tells them?” Who first shared the Gospel with you, and how did God use that person?
2. Acts 1 reminds believers that the Holy Spirit gives us power to be Christ’s witnesses. How does relying on the Spirit change the way we share our faith?
3. According to 1 Peter, every Christian has received gifts to serve others. What gifts or opportunities has God given you to bless His Church?
4. 2 Corinthians teaches that generous giving results in thanksgiving to God. Besides money, what other resources has God entrusted to you for His kingdom?
5. Many Christians struggle to identify their purpose. Based on these passages, what do you think every believer’s purpose includes regardless of career or stage of life?
6. Imagine your church faithfully living out these passages. What impact would it have on your neighborhood, your community, and future generations?

2. *How can you tell someone that Jesus loves them?*
3. *What gifts or talents has God given you to help other people?*
4. *What is one way you can serve someone this week?*
